Objective - To use geographical mapping skills to locate and map cetaceans in the U.K.



<u>Resources</u> - Atlases with U.K maps, U.K map worksheets photocopied onto A3, photo-cards of cetaceans, mini photos of cetaceans for maps, Sea Watch web-site links.

Sea Watch Investigator Task

I wonder which Whales and Dolphins live in our seas?



What to do -

- 1. Give children the copies of the U.K maps and ask them to find the equivalent page in their atlases.
- 2. Children locate and label where they live. Discuss if they have been on holiday to any coastal areas and locate them on their maps.
- 3. Locate and label oceans and seas surrounding the U.K.
- 4. Hand out the photos of the cetaceans. Explain to children that whales, dolphins and porpoise are collectively called cetaceans. Discuss the names of the cetaceans.
- 5. Do children recognise the names of any of them? Have any been lucky enough to see any?
- 6. Read the information together about where the cetaceans may be spotted and in pairs children locate the areas on their maps, using the atlases.

 Explain to children that the animals may also be found in other areas and that these are not isolated to the ones mentioned.
- 7. Using either the mini-photos or a key, children to mark on their maps where the cetaceans are found.
- 8. Discuss whether there is a pattern to the location of cetaceans in the U.K.
